



Good is now an established farm-to-food access program funding and fostering purchasing relationships between local growers and hunger relief agencies. In its fourth year of operation, Growing for Good continued to help meet the need of fresh and nutrient dense food in the hunger relief system, while fine tuning and evolving aspects of the program to best support our farm and hunger relief partners.

PCC's three-year funding commitment of \$100,000 per year has provided both stability and flexibility to the program. In 2023, many of the matchups between farms and hunger relief agencies were consistent from the prior allowing for deeper relational year, partnerships. At the same time, the program brought on two new hunger relief agencies and two new farms. In addition, Growing for Good integrated some program activities with King County Farmers Share, another regional farm-to-food access program, such as monthly cohort meetings and field trips to further develop this network.


